APER IS NOT THE ONLY ONE, ACTING!

Dear Members,

As we mentioned in our press releases, APER is the only one of the 3 health and social services manager associations to react against the paternalistic and discriminatory attitude of the MSSS and the Treasury Board Secretariat (SCT) towards the managers of our network.

While the two other associations in our network are “nicely” playing the government’s game by sitting down and “discussing” while the dices are loaded, APER maintains its request for conciliation and intends to take the necessary legal action to see that you are compensated for the impact of this disregard of your right to negotiate your working conditions and your remuneration.

In addition, we are in constant discussion with our Education counterparts. In this sector, managers associations are angry at the treatment received during “consultations” with their department and TBS.

All the associations of Education managers, like APER, have written to the Director of Negotiations at the TBS, Ms. Édith Lapointe, to denounce the inadmissible treatment done by this government to the associations of managers and their members. They undertake, through their members, concrete actions against the government.

In collaboration with these associations, APER sent an email to Ms. Lapointe denouncing the government’s approach to managers associations and managers themselves, as well as their lack of respect for their own commitments. You will find attached the letter from the education managers associations as well as the email from APER.

For now, a question remains: why in our network with only the three managers associations are we not capable to do common gestures to defend your rights? Please note that the APER has tried many times with the 2 other associations. We remain empty-handed!

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
